Peterborough High School caters for students from 7-12. At the time of this report, the enrolment in 2024 is 57. Peterborough High School is classified as Category 2 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 21% Aboriginal students, 12% students with disabilities, 2% children/young people in care. Governing Council Report

This year saw the implementation of the Berry Street training. This included Sunshine Gatherings and Village Meetings. This included the Wednesday morning block change in structure. This time developed later in the year to provide a mentoring program for the students. This program has achieved many positive results, with students engaging positively in the community around them. Governing Council wish to thank all the community mentors for their time, dedication and knowledge that they provided to our students.

It also was the beginning of the dedicated volleyball lesson for years 7-10. It was also the year for introduction to Diego, the Wellbeing Dog, who is carefully handled by Scott Cullen. We also had the introduction of Passion Projects, which focused on student's passions and interests and yielded some very amazing results.

We had some strong competition in our Sports Days and Swimming Carnival. Many of our students went on to represent our school in higher level competitions. We were lucky enough to have a student represent us at the Schools Sports carnival held in Adelaide, not only swimming but captaining the MNSEC team, well done Cameron.

The Lumination Lab became a reality this year. There are very few schools across South Australia with access to this technology. From this our Lab Champions were born. This gives many opportunities for peer learning. The Lumination Lab was opened to a well receiving community, with many guests in attendance. The hope is to provide students with experiences that would be previously out of reach.

Our students had organised fundraising events for causes that affect our community, including the White Ribbon Foundation, Epilepsy Action Australia and the Fight MND Foundation. Students also attended the dawn service for ANZAC Day. Students also ventured out into our community, with visits to Peterborough Primary School, Saint Josephs and Peterborough Preschool and Rural Care. Through these visits students developed leadership skills, showing children Farm to Fork cooking, providing activities to younger children based on a story and helped Rotary to pack birthing kits for underdeveloped countries.

We have celebrated the diversity in our school, with visitors sharing their stories with the school. We thank Karen Rook and Ashleigh Struck for that privilege. We celebrated Day of the Dead, which was a new experience for the students

Camps included the year 12 retreat to Whyalla, the Arts and Aboriginal Studies camp to Adelaide and The Wilpena Pound overnight camp. These camps provided eye opening insights to students, allowing them to see a different view of the world. We also hosted the MNSEC formal this year.

Governing Council thank all those involved in the Peterborough High School community, for your knowledge, leadership, compassion and wisdom. We sincerely look forward to seeing what the future brings, for our students, the school and our community.

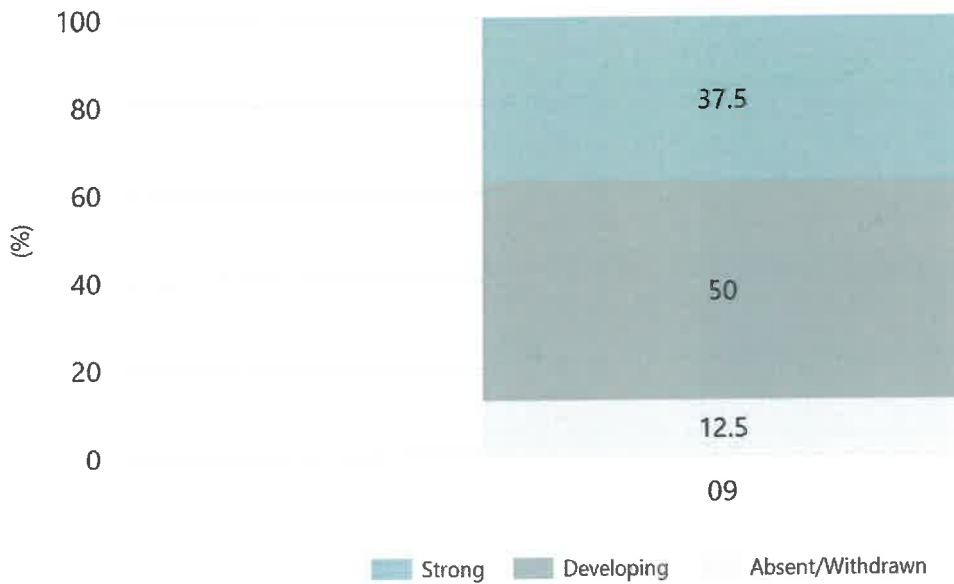

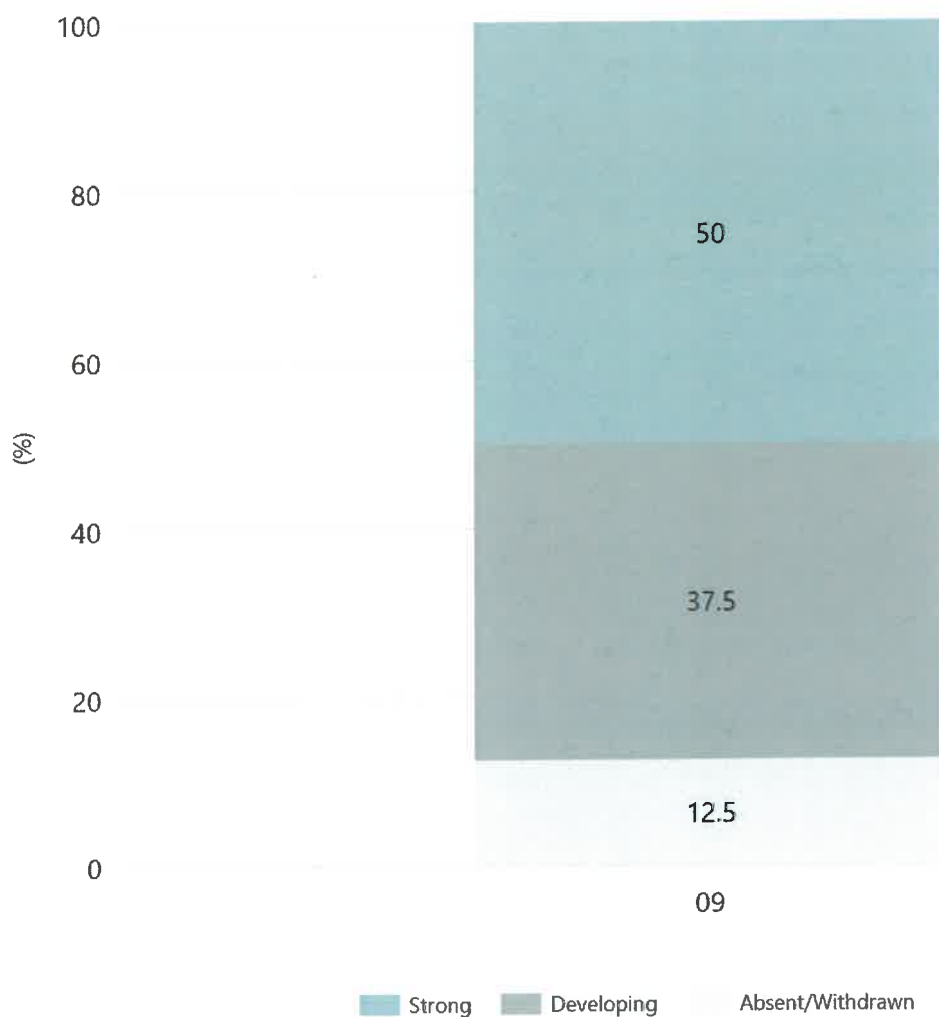

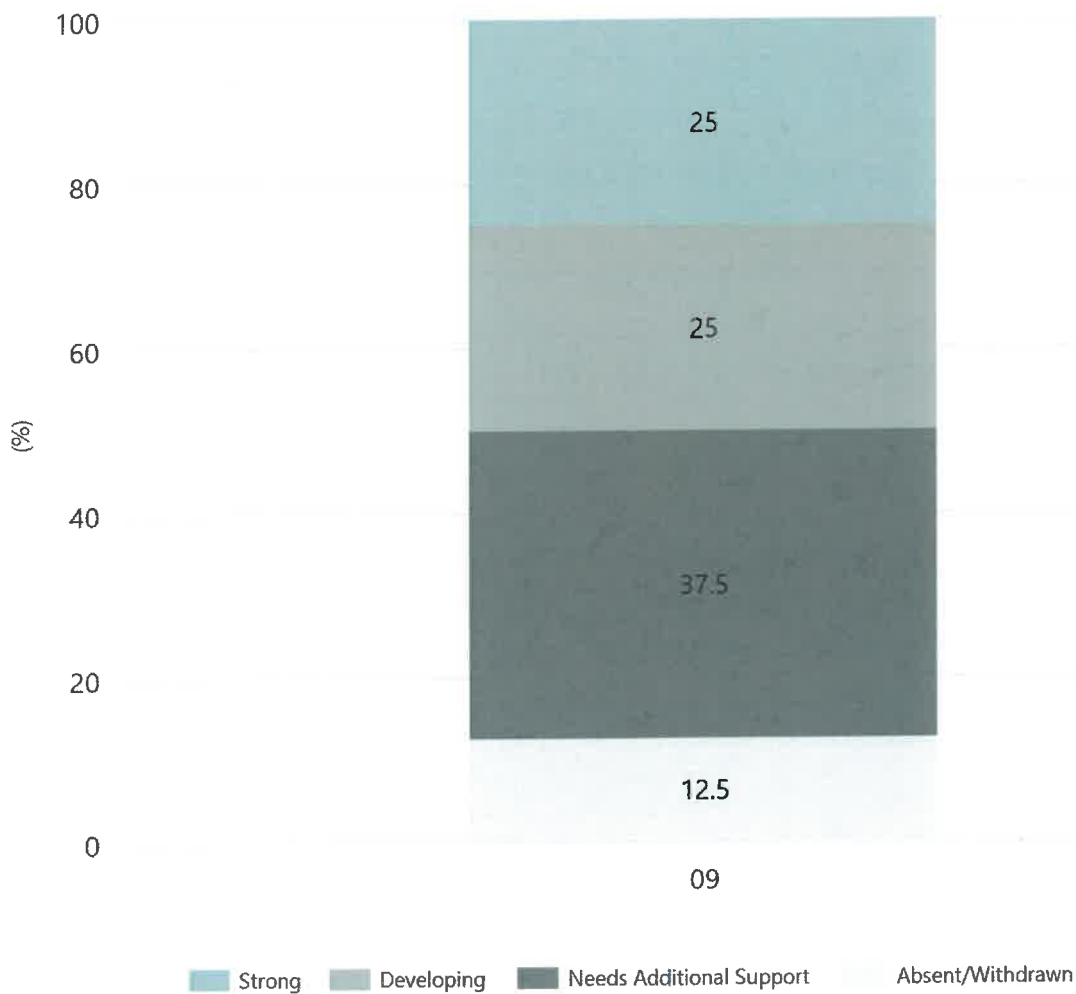

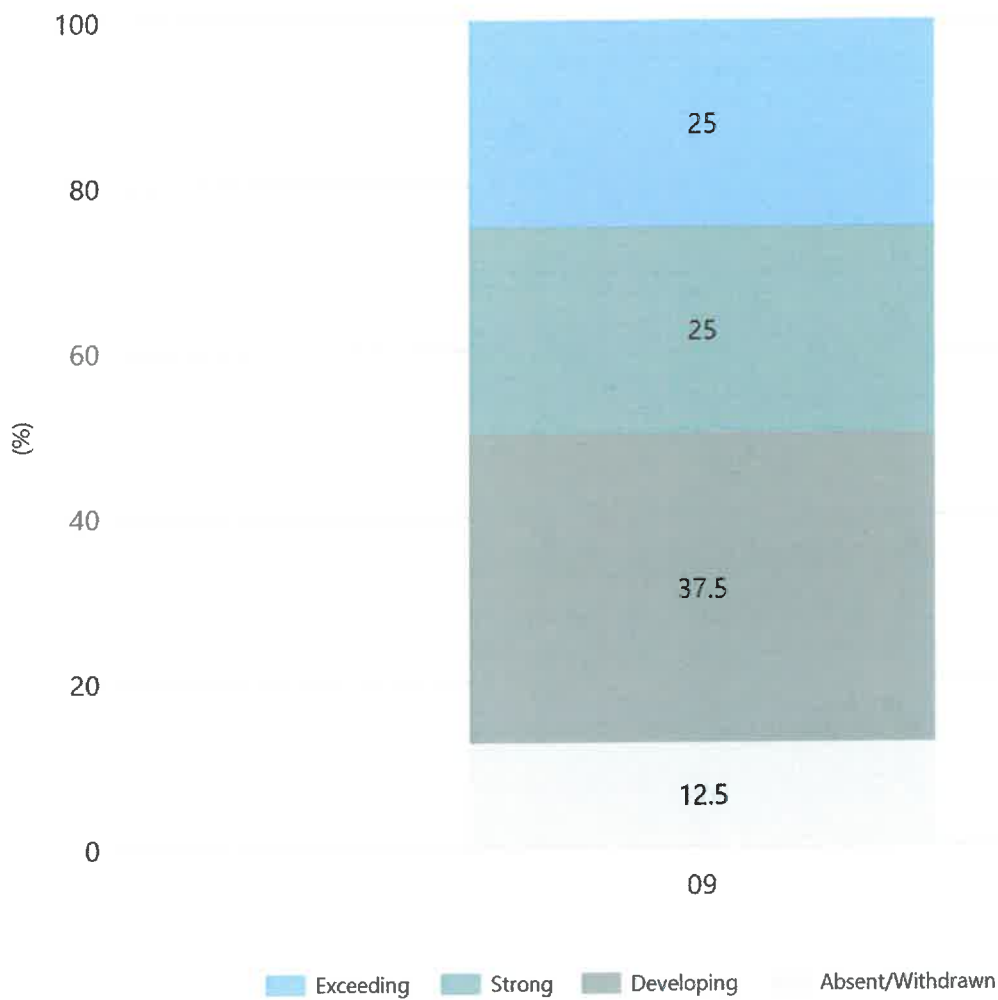

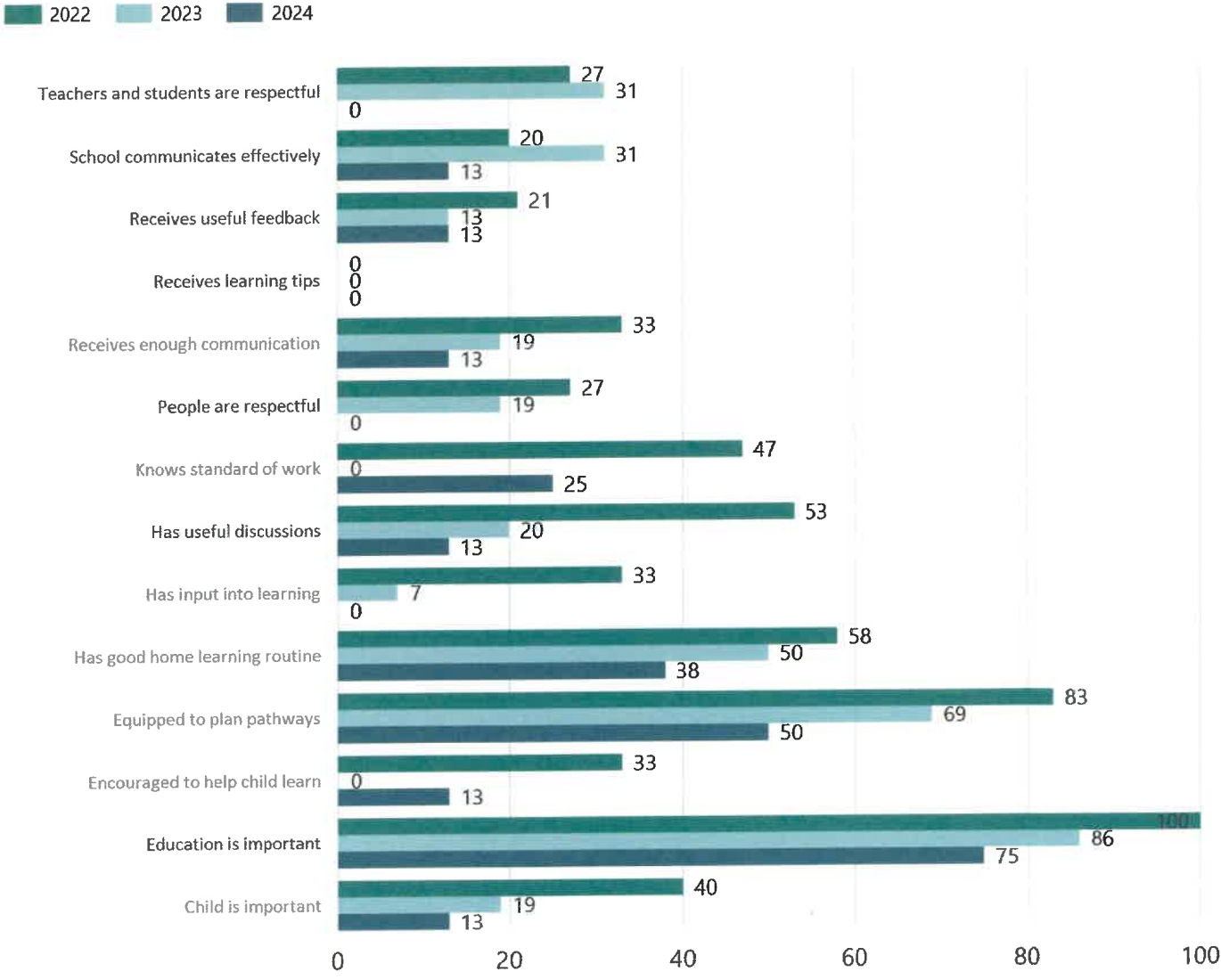

Attendance Comment

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or nongovernment school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
